And by the early afternoon we were back to our usual fortunate weather, ideal for the many patio spectators enjoying our "nearest the pin in two" competition at the 18th.



Darren, as usual, had placed the pins, at my request, in very difficult positions (with one exception) - to challenge the low handicappers, while not having a major impact on the high handicappers. Great work, greenkeepers.

An unusual item this year (with Steve's permission) was a "Beat the Pro" competition. James Broughton, an Asst Pro. at Castle Combe, has regularly played in our Golf Day in the family team - but is now ineligible. As his girl friend took his place in the team, he still wanted to participate in the day. The good news is that at a voluntary £3 per person, only 7 or 8 golfers were nearer the pin at the 6th, so we made an extra £200 - even the sleeves of golf balls that winners received were kindly donated.

Dinner was superb, and a menu selection option for each course was the icing on the cake. All the Club House staff worked exceedingly hard, yet very attentively and cheerfully throughout the whole day - in fact they were given a sustained round of applause by the guests - as Suzanne will vouch. In particular I must compliment all the team in the preparation and appearance of the Dining Room - wow! Last year we thought that 114 guests for dinner would be very cramped,, so we shuddered at the thought of a planned 120 for this year ..... but we needn't have worried. Well done Jenny and her team. However, as I again said last year, I think that must be about the maximum.

As you know. our day is for the Princess Alice Hospice and for Brain Tumour Research. Not only have the compliments been many, and 2012 Golf Day bookings already being verbally reserved, but most importantly we have made at least £7000 in total for these two charities, at a time when they really need support.
